Candidates who are willing to get the IAF Jobs must have Passed Three years Diploma Course in Engineering, from a Government recognized Polytechnic Institute with 50% marks, and 50% marks in English in Diploma or in Intermediate / Matriculation, if English is not a subject in Diploma Course

Group 'Y' (Non-Technical) Trade:

The Indian Air Force (IAF) conducts every year the common entrance exam for the post of Non Technical Group Y. The exam is conducted by the Indian Air Force to short list eligible applicants for different technical and non-technical posts respectively. The applicants who wish to apply in the concerned recruitment exam must go through the complete details of the examination including the paper pattern, marking scheme and qualifying criteria from the information as given here below.

INDIAN NAVY

The Indian Navy conducts the recruitment exam for the appointment of eligible candidates in the Indian Navy Sailor and Artificer Apprentice Sailors positions respectively. Every year a lot of candidates parti-cipate in the concerned recruitment exam to get appointed in the concerned positions. The main exams that are included under the Artificer Apprentice Recruitment are – Written Test, Physical Fitness Test and Medical Standard Examinations respectively.

Role of Navy

The full range of operations in which a nation's naval forces may be involved is vast, ranging from high intensity war fighting at one end to humanitarian assistance and disaster relief operations at the other end. This broad continuum of operations can be broken down into distinct roles, each demanding a specific approach to the conduct of operations.

CDS

The combined Defence Services (CDS) Examination is conducted by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC). It is conducted twice a year for the recruitment of candidates into the following institutions of the armed forces of India:

- 1. Indian Military Academy (IMA): It is the officers's training academy of the Indian Army. It is located in the foothills of the Himalayas at Dehradun in the state of Uttarakhand. It was established in 1932.
- 2. Officers' Training Academy (OTA): It is a training establishment of the Indian Army that trains officers for the Short Service Commission. It was established in 1963 and is situated at Chennai in Tamil Nadu.
- 3. Indian Naval Academy (INA): It is established in May 1969. It is the initial officer training establishment of the Indian Navy and the Indian Coast Guard. It is situated in Ezhimala in the Kannur district of Kerala. It is the largest naval academy in Asia.
- **4. Indian Air Force Academy (IAFA):** It is the premier training centre of the Indian Air Force and is the cradle of training for pilots, ground duty and technical officers of Indian Air Force. It was established in 1969 near Hyderabad.

Qualifications:

Education:

- (i) For I.M.A. and Officers' Training Academy Degree from a recognized University or equivalent.
- (ii) For Indian Naval Academy Degree in Engineering from a recognized University / Institution.
- (iii) For Air Force Academy Degree from a recognised University (with Physics and Mathematics at 10+2 level) or Bachelor of Engineering.

Graduates with the first choice as Army/Navy/Air Force are to submit the proof of the graduation – provisional certificates on the date of the commencement of the Service Selection Board (SSB) interview at the SSB. Candidates who are studying in the final year/semester degree course and have yet to pass the final year degree examination can also apply, provided the candidate should not have any present backlog up to the last semester/year for which the results have been declared up to the time of the submission of the application.

Marital Status and Nationality:

A candidate must be unmarried and must either be:

- (i) a citizen of India, or
- (ii) a subject of Bhutan, or
- (iii) a citizen of Nepal, or
- (iv) a Tibetan refugee who came over to India before 1st January 1962 with the intention of permanently settling in India, or
- (v) a person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka and East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, Malawi, Zaire and Ethiopia or Vietnam with the intention of permanently settling in India. Provided that a candidate belonging to categories (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) above shall be a person in whose favour a certificate of eligibility has been issued by the Government of India. Certificate of eligibility will, however, not be necessary in the case of candidates who are Gorkha subjects of Nepal.

Notification of the Examination:

Generally, the notification for the examination is released in the months of October and June, and the examination are conduted in February and November, respectively.

The Scheme, standard and Syllabus of the Examination:

- 1. The competitive examination comprises:
 - (a) Written examination (b) Interview for intelligence and personality test (such candidates may be called for an interview at one of the Services Selection Centres).
- 2. The subjects of the written examination, the time allowed and the maximum marks allotted to each subject will be as follows:

(a) For admission to Indian Military Academy, Indian Naval Academy and Air Force Academy:

- 3. The maximum marks allotted to the written examination and to the interviews will be equal for each course, i.e., the maximum marks allotted to the written examination and to the interviews will be 300, 300, 300 and 200 each for admission to the Indian Military Academy, Indian Naval Academy, Air Force Academy and Officers' Training Academy respectively.
- 4. The papers in all the subjects will consist of objective-type questions only. The question papers (Test Booklets) of General Knowledge and Elementary Mathematics will be set bilingually in Hindi as well as English.
- 5. In the question papers, wherever necessary, questions involving the metric system of Weights and Measures only will be set.
- 6. Candidates must write the papers themselves. In no circumstances will they be allowed to take the help of a scribe to write answers for them.
- 7. The Commission has the discretion to fix qualifying marks in any or all the subjects of the examination.
- 8. The candidates are not permitted to use a calculator for answering objective-type papers (Test Booklets). They should not, therefore, bring the same inside the Examination Hall.

Standard of the Examination

The standard of the papers in Elementary Mathematics will he of Matriculation level, while in other subjects, the standard will approximately be such as may be expected of a graduate of an Indian University.

AFCAT

AFCAT stands for Air Force Common Admission Test. This test is conducted by the Indian Air Force for selection of officers in all branches of the IAF (except medical and dental) viz. Flying Branch (Short Service Commission only), Technical Branch (Permanent Commission and Short Service Commission) and Ground Duty Branch (Permanent Commission and Short Service Commission). AFCAT is conducted twice a year (in the month of February and August). The advertisement for the same is published in the months of December and June respectively.

Applications are invited from Male and Female from Indian citizens as per Citizenship Act 1955 for the following courses commencing in January for grant of Short Service Commission in Flying Branch and Permanent/Short Service Commission in Technical and Ground Duty branches.
